

The following is an addendum to the 2004 Eastern and Midwestern Series Rules, to be effective immediately.

Addendum 1

Section 5.4, Race Series Points and Scoring

For the determination of the Race Series Champion, the total number of points earned throughout the season will be totaled and the lowest two scores will be deducted (this includes zeros and mechanical did not finishes, as well as races in which a driver did not participate).

Addendum 2

Section 5.4, Race Series Points and Scoring

Regional points shall be awarded to drivers based upon their finishing position as follows:

Doubles will be allowed and will score only the points that are available for whichever group is assigned.

Example: A “Championship” contender wants to double on a weekend where there are only three groups, “Championship”, “Expert” and “Sportsman”. He/she will be slotted into the Expert group for their double and can only score the maximum of 33pts. If an “Expert” or “Sportsman” wants to double, he/she will be put into a faster group only and can score whatever points are available.

Addendum 3

Section 5.5, Bonus Points

There will be no bonus points awarded at Interregional Race weekends.

Addendum 4

Section 5.7, Master's Championship

The Masters' point system is identical to the Championship group, with one "throw away" tabulated.

The Masters points will be awarded as follows:

Example:

Number of Masters in each group: C = 3, E = 2, S = 3

Championship group = Masters first – third

Expert group = Masters fourth – fifth

Sportsman group = Masters sixth – eighth

If there is more than one of each grouping category at the weekend (example, two Expert groups), points will be awarded as follows:

Example:

Number of Masters in each group: C = 3, E1 = 4, E2 = 3, S = 2

Championship group = Masters first – third

Expert 1 group = Masters fourth – seventh

Expert 2 group = Masters fourth – eighth

Sportsman group = Masters ninth – ten
